DISTINCTIONS IN THE FACULTY OF HUMANITIES

Bachelors degrees may be awarded with distinction

in a subject, where the student has an average of at least 75% and no mark below 70%

in the degree, where the student has both distinction in at least one subject and first class passes in at least 10 courses.

Honours degrees are awarded by class (first, second class division one, second class division two, or third).

Master's degrees may be awarded with distinction

for the dissertation, (in a coursework and dissertation curriculum) for especially meritorious work, the dissertation being in the first class (75% or better)

in the degree, for especially meritorious work, where the average is 75% or better and no component is below 70%.

PRESIDENT OF CONVOCATION MEDAL

HUGH AMOORE

The President of Convocation Medal is awarded annually to an alumnus or alumna who has made a significant contribution to the common good.

“The medieval university looked backwards; it professed to be a storehouse of old knowledge. The modern university looks forward, and is a factory of new knowledge.” Thomas Huxley

Hugh Amooore combines the best aspects of both types of university as described by Huxley.

Hugh Amooore was appointed Registrar of UCT in 1987. He became only the seventh person to hold this post at UCT. The Cape Times at the time headlined the announcement of his appointment as the *“Youngest-ever Registrar at UCT”*. His 42 years of service to UCT included 27 years as Registrar by the time he retired at the end of 2015. During his career he served the administration of five UCT Vice-Chancellors. But his impact has not only been felt at UCT. He has assisted - in both formal and an informal advisory capacity - many other universities, thereby serving higher education across South Africa. He continues to do so to this very day.

Even as a student in the early 1970s, Hugh Amooore contributed to UCT’s reputation of service, activism and excellence. He excelled academically, was a very good athlete, served as SRC Secretary, was active in NUSAS and as sub-warden of the Kopano student residence. At a time when student politics in the country was closely watched by the security police and during the time that NUSAS had to contend with the formation of the Black Consciousness South African Students’ Organisation, Hugh Amooore was among the small band of student leaders who were having to examine closely the role of the white liberal and the left in the political developments in South Africa.

His student activities prepared him for his later professional roles at UCT. His career was launched as a staff member in the Student Affairs Department at UCT in 1974. His letter of application, like much of his correspondence since then, was penned in his classic calligraphy style. He rose through the ranks of Academic Planning Officer (1978), Academic Secretary (1984) and Registrar in January 1987.

UCT Vice-Chancellors relied heavily on him, particularly as they took on the tasks of revising academic planning and administration, and pursuing and safeguarding the prized principle of academic freedom and institutional autonomy. He found and developed ways to get around apartheid restrictions in order to bring into UCT students who, according to the apartheid government, did not belong here.

He relished the challenges that difficult times brought to UCT and he was a key member of the senior leadership of the University that helped steer the institution through those difficult times.

PRESIDENT OF CONVOCATION MEDAL (CONTINUED)

A previous Vice-Chancellor - Dr Stuart Saunders – recalls Hugh Amoore’s leading role in UCT’s decision to take the apartheid government to court for attaching unlawful conditions to the awarding of university subsidies. Dr Saunders wrote as follows: “In this matter the wise counsel of Hugh Amoore, the University Registrar, gave strength to the arguments in favour of taking legal action, a step which I fully supported. We took action jointly with the University of the Western Cape ... A victory was essential to maintain the independence of the University and to allow staff and students to protest against the iniquitous laws under which we were being forced to live.” The judges found unanimously in favour of the University in a judgement that was delivered early in 1988.

Besides his knowledge of the University and the changing needs of the student population, Hugh Amoore has seen UCT and student and academic life across the country change in various ways. He has been through all the experiments with Higher Education policy. Over the years while he was Registrar, UCT enrolled a growing number of Black students. This development meant that much had to change at the University. Among such transformation initiatives were the policies on racism as well as sexual harassment, and attention that had to be paid to institutional culture at UCT. Amoore was Registrar when the struggle for transformation at UCT was taken to another level with the outbreak of #RhodesMustFall, and later #FeesMustFall in 2015.

Hugh Amoore has a reputation among all university administrators in South Africa. Having served at UCT for as long as he did, he is much in demand to assist other universities. His knowledge of higher education policy formation has earned him the reputation of being an authority on higher education. He has also been utilized by the Department of Higher Education, as well as the Commission for Higher Education.

The award of the President of Convocation medal recognises the way Hugh Amoore has represented UCT and higher education, and the dignity he has conferred on the institution through his consistent attention to detail; for the service he has given over more than four decades and the imagination and innovation he has brought to that service; for the ways he has collaborated with colleagues at UCT; and with other institutions and government agencies in South African higher education; and for the critical thought he has put into every activity he has initiated, led and carried to completion at UCT.

The President of Convocation has deemed it fit that Mr Hugh Amoore is deserving of the award of the prestigious President of Convocation’s Award for 2016.
